- 2. Our Environmental Management System (EMS) is continually improving in order to achieve long-term mission sustainability. In support of our environmental policy, we will:
- a. Maintain an effective EMS to improve our environmental performance and minimize impact to Gunfighters, their families and the environment;

- c. Provide management oversight and adequate training to instill environmental stewardship and ensure understanding of the EMS and its requirements;

- e. Provide regular operation-specific environmental performance reviews and assessments through the Environmental, Safety and Occupational Health Compliance Assessment and Management Program and develop plans to address noncompliance while identifying opportunities for improved management;

 - g. Strive to maximize resource conservation.
