SUBJECT: 366th Fighter Wing Environmental Commitment Statement

1. The 366th Fighter Wing (366 FW) is committed to accomplishing its mission while protecting human health, natural resources, and the environment. We are dedicated to environmental sustainability through continual improvement of our processes, reducing environmental risks, and promoting pollution prevention where ever possible while complying with all federal, state, and local environmental laws/regulations while adhering to Executive Orders, DoD and AF Policy, and regional and local environmental concerns (AFI 32-7001, para 3.1.2).
2. Our Environmental Management System (EMS) is continually improving in order to achieve long-term mission sustainability. In support of our environmental commitment statement, we will:
 - a. Maintain an effective EMS to improve our environmental performance and minimize impact to Gunfighters, their families, and the environment.
 - b. Set goals, measure progress, take corrective action when needed and communicate results to Gunfighters, the community, regulators, and the public.
 - c. Provide management oversight and adequate training to instill environmental stewardship, ensure understanding of the EMS and its requirements, and obtain a commitment to compliance.
 - d. Provide regular operation-specific environmental performance reviews and assessments through the Environmental, Safety and Occupational Health Compliance Assessment and Management Program, and develop plans to address noncompliance.
